A SHORT BACKSTORY OF COHSMO

Inequalities between various localities seem to be on the rise, differences that threaten the social cohesion at local, regional and national levels and even produce serious tensions between European countries.

A number of changes have influenced the position of many localities; globalisation and industrial restructuring have triggered a round of changes on the labour market, which have favoured especially larger cities. Intensified urbanization is taking place in many countries as a consequence, a process that includes migration of particualry younger people.

One outcome is that small towns and rural districts have lost a good deal of their population and the avarage age of the remainders is increasing. The same type of localities have large numbers of uninhabited homes, which slowly deteriorate while larger cities suffer from rising housing costs due to the growing demand.

COHSMO investigates the relation between socioeconomic structures of inequality, urbanization and territorial cohesion, and how territorial cohesion at different European scales affect economic growth, spatial justice and democratic capacities.
